


- Changing profile of learners increasing % of P1 students with EL as the predominant home language


Area Enhancements

Reading	 Teaching of Close and Critical Reading Skills Teaching of reading comprehension skills more systematically Introduction of word study lessons to strengthen word recognition skills Extensive Reading Ringfencing of one reading period a week, starting at lower primary Provision of additional reading resources in SLS
Oracy	 Explicit Teaching of Oracy Skills Provision of oracy lessons to promote thinking and enable our students to discuss, reflect and express their ideas confidently and persuasively







STELLAR ACTIVITIES


- Students can look forward to a wide range of activities conducted in line with their learning in STELLAR such as those listed below:
